The top three clubs in Candy Box collection were Wichita with \$5,228.70, Houston Clear Lake with \$2,179.65, El Dorado with \$2,167.24. The Muskogee club came a close fourth with \$2,090.20 and Paragould, Bartlesville Uptown and Hutchinson all collected over \$1,000.

In Coin Box collection, the top three were Wichita with \$1,445.86, Bartlesville with \$884.85 and Hutchinson with \$669.12 in revenues.

For the past 50 years, Broken Arrow Civitan Club has been enriching the lives of their members and the community. The club's members have sponsored scholarships and programs for college-bound youth, raised funds for sick or needy children, coordinated the annual Christmas Parade and served pancakes during Rooster Days, among myriad fundraising ventures. The club also donates to various organizations like Broken Arrow Neighbors and A New Leaf.

Kim Goddard, executive director of Broken Arrow Neighbors, said the group has been a "constant source of support."

"Their level of dedication to our mission

is invaluable," Goddard said. "Broken Arrow Neighbors is truly a more effective organization as a result of this partnership [with Civitan]."

The Broken Arrow Civitans built a baseball diamond and dugouts behind the Salvation Army's Broken Arrow Boys and Girls Club for the Broken Arrow Challenger Special Olympics. They also have helped add wheelchair-accessible sidewalks in the complex and provide money for uniforms, equipment, trophies, snacks and other needs, de Reign said.



Molly Faucault, director of Broken Arrow Challenger Sports, said the Civitans' efforts have made playing sports a reality for the 75-plus kids that participate in the Special Olympics.

Sam Muskrat, a member since 1963, has watched the club grow along with Broken Arrow since he opened an accounting business in the then-town of 6,000. Muskrat has participated in projects like the sign in Civitan Park, which sits on the corner of Elm Place and 71st Street, and securing a community center for the community in the 1960s.

But more than anything, Muskrat said the friendships and the weekly breakfasts keep

him coming back.

"Over the years I've had a host of very good friends that had a desire to improve the community," Muskrat said. "Civic work is a premise of Civitans - "Builders of good citizenship" is our motto. We're just a nice group of people. I think the fraternalism is the bond."

The Civitans meet at 6:30 a.m. every Friday at The Senior Center, 1800 S. Main St. for biscuits and gravy and some "good-natured brow beating."
