Also attending the luncheon was the Jr Civitan Club's sponsor, Dr. Renee Dexter, school psychologist and cheerleader coach.

The Shawnee Heights Jr Civitan Club has about 40 members and is involved in several activities and projects. One unique yearly project is having a simulation seminar on the challenges disabled people have on a daily basis. During the seminar the club members simulate many different types of disability. This helps club members understand and appreciate the challenges of special needs citizens.

Another unique project was, using the money they earned from various projects, to provide a limousine to transport students from their school to a Prom for special needs students.

The Jr Civitan Club also was involved in Special Olympics Bowling and raising around \$2,000 during the Polar Plunge fundraiser which helps special needs citizens at Topeka's Sheltered Living.




A Word from the PR Chair OF PROCLAMATIONS AND COINS

Candy Box Project Needs Your Help

Civitan International Candy Box Manager Debra Smith has had to issue "nasty grams" to some of our clubs who are failing to comply with the Candy Box Agreement. Some of the clubs, including several in our district, are making candy purchases with the Sam's Club credit card provided by Civitan International, but are not turning in funds on a monthly basis as required—in a few cases, they are not sending in any money at all. Currently, less than 45% of the 22 clubs that have remitted some monies are doing so monthly. The big problem is clubs who only send in funds when they build up to \$100 to \$200. If you want to know if your club falls into this category, ask your Club President, Candy Box Chair, and Treasurer how they handle this.

GONE BUT NEVER TO BE FORGOTTEN

The Corpus Christi Civitan Club has lost two Special People.



IMOGENE BAKER

November 28, 1918-January 25, 2011

Imogene Baker passed away at the age of 92. She was the wife of Founding Member Coley Baker. Imogene was born on the family farm in Florence, Texas, where she and her 7 siblings worked alongside their parents planting crops, picking cotton

and tending the livestock. In 1942, she married Coley Baker who had joined the Army Air Corps. After his discharge in 1945, they located in Austin, Texas, where was a member of the Austin Civitan Club before they moved to Corpus Christi and started building a club there which Chartered on December 5. 1953. Imogene belonged to the Ladies of Civitan Club.

They opened the highly successful Roosevelt-Baker Photo Co. Her skill at photo restoration was recognized throughout the United States. After Coley passed away in 2000, Imogene continued to operate the business until failing health caused her to retire and close the business in December 2007.

Imogene is survived by one daughter, one son, a sister and a brother and five grand children and five great-grandchildren. The Corpus Civitans are grateful to Imogene and Coley for their legacy in Civitan.



REV. ERNEST F. BENNETT August 21, 1921-February 12, 2011

Reverend Ernest Bennett was nicknamed a modern day Matthew, for working as a city tax appraiser while serving as chaplain of the Corpus Christi club for over 30 years. E.F., as he was known, was

pastor of at least six churches during his life, a

columnist for the Corpus Christi Caller-Times, a community leader and a chaplain for the police department. Before entering the ministry, he served in WWII and was a professional saxophonist.

He was influential and inspiration to the city council and school board. Bennett's most lasting legacy may be in education; he taught in Robstown and West Oso and served as educational director for the local NAACP. Bennett's name is on the cornerstone of the education building at Mount Pilgrim Baptist Church in Refugio.

His name is also on a scholarship fund administered by the Coastal Bend Community Foundation, which Bennett established with proceeds from the sale of his book, "Character Counts: Do You Agree?" His columns always ended with the same three words, part admonition, part challenge, always an invitation to learning: "Do you agree?"

Bennett's life was celebrated in a memorial service with over 400 in attendance, including an honor guard from the Corpus Christi Police Department and the American Legion who gave a gun salute. He was further honored by a resolution in the Texas Senate. He is survived by wife of 48 years, Ikoza Marie, two sons, 23 grandchildren and many great-grand children, nieces, nephews, and cousins. (I'd say that was a life well lived-do you agree?)

Springs. The 60 plus delegates who arrived in time for the Friday night game show were thoroughly entertained and learned some new things about the five

Civitan couples who were the contestants.

The following morning, following a buffet breakfast, our traditional Parade of Club Banners took place under the direction of the Sgt.-at-Arms, Abe Davenport, member of the Yes We Can Civitan Club. Governor Ken Ellis then officially opened the general session. The delegates were then introduced to the West Siloam Springs, OK Mayor, Elaine Carr, who presented a proclamation from the City of West Siloam Springs. Also during the session, the Governor presented an overview of the district, followed with remarks by Gov.-Elect, Jo West Taylor.

A video presentation about the upcoming Civitan International Convention to be held July 6-9 in New Orleans was shared with the

delegates. Immediate Past-Gov. Debbie Juhlke encouraged potential candidates for the positions of Gov.-Elect and Area Directors for Areas 2 & 4 to gather their endorsements and proper registration with the District Secretary for the elections to be held during the

annual convention to be held in Tulsa August 5-7. District Board Member Jack Fournier presented an inspiring challenge to members to go home and share Civitan with others to increase growth in their local clubs.

The morning session also included clubs providing reports on their activities during the current Civitan Year. District Secretary Jeannetta Edwards also provided a workshop on the computer basics for reporting club officers to the District and International.

Following the lunch break, delegates reported to various locations where Area Meetings were then conducted by the respective Area Directors or their representatives. Door prizes were awarded to many of the attendees throughout the weekend.

During the banquet Saturday evening delegates were treated to an interesting life story of Mayor of Siloam Springs,

David Allen, who presented the Heartland District with a proclamation from the city. The meeting was concluded on Sunday morning with a memorial service for Heartland Civitans who have died during the past six months.

Given that 84 persons were registered, one

could say that having a spring meeting after a two year absence was well received. Another indicator is the fact that less than 12% in attendance were there because of required responsibilities such as board members or other meeting responsibilities for the weekend.

Twenty-nine of the thirty-nine (74.4%) of the clubs in the Heartland District were represented by one or more attendees, including a representative from one of the newest clubs, Maumelle, which was chartered during the 4th quarter of last year. Even more impressive, we had a charter member of the brand new campus club, The Tulsa Community College Virtual Campus Club, which had not even officially chartered at the time of the meeting. Although profits were lower than anticipated, the event provided the team with a grant of \$700 to help offset a portion of their expenses incurred when traveling outside the area for various events.

Plus they continue to deliver food commodities to two low-income housing units once a month in cooperation with the Salvation Army.




Starlight Club Puts *Civitas* Into Practice
